

## Gathering IV Scenic Tour of Fairfield County and The Hocking Hills

Mileage	Description
0.0	From the Hampton Inn turn right on Schorway Dr. then right on Whittier Dr. then left on Memorial Drive.
18.2	Exit SR 664, then turn right on SR 664.
20.0	Sharp left curve continue on SR 664.
20.6	Sharp right curve, stay on SR 664.
28.2	Continue straight on SR 664.
29.0	Enter Old Man's Cave Area (Visitor's Center/Snack Bar).
29.4	Old Man's Cave Lodge is to the left, continue on SR 664.
30.6	Turn right onto SR 374.
35.0	Bear left stay on SR 374.
36.7	Rock House is on right, continue on SR374.
37.8	Turn right onto SR 180.
42.5	Continue straight on SR 180.
42.9	Sharp left curve.
46.9	Turn left onto US 33 ramp (West US 33).
49.0	Turn right into Hocking Hills Market. The market has flea markets, antique shop diner and miscellaneous small shops. It is suggested that you take some time to visit this interesting area and have a snack at the diner.

*After your visit you may return to Lancaster on US 33 West or you may return by taking the Fairfield County Scenic Tour with a length of 32.5 miles.*

### **To return to Lancaster:**

Turn right onto US 33 West. Bear right on Lancaster Business Route Co Rd 33A (Old US 33) and continue into Lancaster. This will become Memorial Drive and you will continue through Lancaster and return to the Hampton by turning right on Whittier Dr.

- 0.0 Turn right onto US 33 West (Set trip odometer at 0).
- 2.0 Turn left onto Clearcreek Rd.
- 8.1 Turn right to continue on Clearcreek Rd.
- 8.5 Turn right onto Revenge Rd.
- 12.4 Enter Southeast Correctional Institute Area.
- 12.7 Turn left on Christmas Rock Rd. (Not marked, at the prison entrance turn toward the fenced prison area).
- If you pass the large yellow house on right you missed your turn!*
- 15.3 Turn right on Hamburg Rd.
- 16.2 Turn left on Snoke Rd.
- 16.7 Bear right onto Stonewall Cemetery Rd.
- 17.1 On the left is the Stonewall Cemetery. This stonewall cemetery was built by one of the early families in the area. They built it with the understanding that any American President could be buried there, however, none have taken up the offer!
- 17.6 Cross US 22. You are now on Crumley Rd.
- 19.9 Cross Delmont Rd, continue on Crumley Rd.
- 21.4 Stop at Mt. Zion Rd., the continue on Crumley Rd.
- 23.2 Turn right onto Rockmill Rd.
- 23.7 Stop for SR 188, continue on Rockmill Rd.
- 25.2 Stop for Royalton Rd., continue on Rockmill Rd.
- 27.3 Turn right on Lithopolis Rd.
- 27.4 On the right is Rockmill. In the last few years it has come under the ownership of the Fairfield County Parks and plans are being made to restore it. The Rockmill covered bridge was one of the last covered bridges in Fairfield County to be taken out of service. You just crossed the new bridge that was constructed to bypass the Rockmill covered bridge just west of this structure.

- 30.4 Turn left on Collins Rd and then an immediate right onto County Rd. 33A, Memorial Drive (formerly US 33).
- 32.1 Turn left on Schorway Drive.
- 32.5 Turn right into Hampton Inn.
